Children explored themes including local flora and fauna, climate and weather, mateship, family, agriculture, and working animals—each piece a heartfelt reminder of the strength and spirit of the Mallee.

A special celebration event was held at Quambatook Caravan Park on Tuesday 15th April to announce the winners and unveil the large-scale artworks.

All entrants received a free ticket to the Quambatook Tractor Pull, held on Easter Saturday. The three winning entries also received vouchers to spend at local businesses.
